All of a sudden life came to a stand still with a lot of uncertainties about another day in life, about a tomorrow - job. education, medical facilities and above all, the very sustenance of life. But nothing could stop Maharashtra Prabodhan Seva Mandal (MPSM) from reaching out to those in need, especially people living on the margins. MPSM reached out to more than 8000 families in the remote tribal areas, working along with the government administration, distributing dry ration kits, providing symptomatic and preventive medicine and counseling care through its 4 Mobile Covid-19 Care Units (MCCU) in the 4 talukas of Nashik - Peth, Surgana, Trimbakeshwar and also Nashik. Besides, MPSM reached out to more than 1500 students in their respective villages helping them keep in touch with their learning and keep going through the trying times with hope and confidence. MPSM reached out to farmers having no access to agricultural inputs, distributing seeds for monsoon sowing, saplings for plantation, vegetable seeds for kitchen gardening (parasbaug), and so on.

The joy of connecting with people in times of trials and struggles gave a sense of joy and purpose to us at MPSM. With the confidence that THIS TOO SHALL PASS we carry on with our mission of reaching out to the unreachable by taking our services to doorsteps. Together we walk, together we grow and together we shall overcome the Pandemic and uncertainties of life.

"We aim at enhancing the quality of life of small and marginal rural farming communities for self-reliance."








MPSM'S AREA OF OPERATIONS

BREAKING THE WALL OF IGNORANCE

Our Education Program is committed to an ongoing research understanding methods and techniques of learning of Adivasi children and accordingly design and develop teaching aids and learning modules. Through these experiments we have been making concerted efforts to improve quality of Tribal Education through support classes in padas (hamlets) and villages.

ACTIVITIES OF SUPPORT CLASSES 2021-2022

- Promotion of Kitchen Garden (Parasbaug) for nutritional sufficiency:
 - **882** families covered under the initiative (with a packet each to a family containing 10 varieties of vegetable seeds)



We are running a total of **61** classes in 2 districts of Maharashtra, benefiting **1,525 tribal children** who otherwise do not have a better source of educational support. Many villagers have mentioned that our classes have helped their children to cope with the gap that happened in education due to COVID-19.

THE GREEN DREAM


VANIKARAN

The project aims at the reforestation and biodiversity enhancement of areas MPSM is working in; every year, we distribute more than one lakh saplings of wild fruits and other native species, including bamboo and teak.

OUR GREEN WARRIORS

With the help of the Education
Department of MPSM, we have come
up with the concept 'Green Warriors',
where we are giving saplings to our
NFE classes students. Each child gets 12 saplings with one kitchen garden
(vegetable seeds) kit for the family for
taking care of their nutritional needs.
Our Green Worriors are playing a
significant role in the awareness we are
trying to create.

This year we have distributed a total

105457 saplings of forest and fruit trees Teak, Bamboo, Cashew, Jamun, Mango.
Jackfruit, Bahava, Behada, Chinch, Shevari,
Ashoka, Hirda, Kadunimb, Khaya,
Kanchan, Ramfal, Shevga, Mahua, Karanj,
Aonla, Tetu, Saptaparni, Sitafal, Gulmohar
- native as well as improved species
aiming local biodiversity enhancement
and recreation.

ACTION THROUGH RESEARCH INNOVATION

PCR is currently focussing on enhancing the growth of crops using organic inputs and also studying the effect of the inputs on the soil microflora. Currently, we are focussing on the aquatic fern - Azolla. And studying the benefits it has on the growth of paddy and on the health of animals and birds when administered as feed and fodder.





HIMAI Adivasi Farmer Producer Company, registered on the 25th of May 2018, today has:

- 1037 farmer base
- 37 Tribal villages covered in Dindori Tehsil of Nashik
- 400+ farmer shareholders.

THEY FOUGHT FOR WATER

The project is in progress, which has installed a complete domestic water distribution system with an in-house service connection in Vadamal-Berwal, a tribal village in Surgana Tehsil of Nashik District. This project will provide water at the doorstep of 123 families of 700 village population for drinking and other household needs. It was a fight for their right because fetching water was a nightmare for the village women from a slope of 2 kilometers, waiting for their turns through the night.



WATER DISTRIBUTION PROJECT - VADMAL


Hirabai, a village woman, shares, "I have been doing this my whole life. I don't want the same life for my daughter! Till when are we supposed to struggle like this? We need to walk almost 2 km for 2-3 pots of water. I can't explain the situation in summer; we migrate for water. Otherwise, who would like to leave their home and roam like Nomads!



AND THEY ARE NOT SCARED OF TREATMENT ANYMORE

"We do not have corona virus here".
"You are the ones who are bringing the virus because you are wearing masks".
"Dare you give us injections". "Have you been sent by the government?"

Well, these were some of the reactions of the villagers as they saw us covered with surgical head cap, mask, face shield, gloves and aprons. Some would even close their doors at our sight. While the government medicos were beaten and driven away in some villages, we were fortunate enough not to meet similar fate. Indeed, the reason for this resistance was FEAR. But the story changed soon.






The second wave camps started on 26th Apr 2021 and continued thereafter in many forms through different approaches, reaching out to more than 45+ Gram Panchayats and Villages in the 3 talukas (blocks) of Peth, Surgana and Trimbakeshwar. We had 3800+ patients visiting our camps out of which 500+ were suspected cases.

NON-TIMBER FOREST PRODUCTS
(NTFPS): ENHANCING LIVELIHOOD
SECURITY FOR THE TRIBAL
COMMUNITIES IN WESTERN
MAHARASHTRA THROUGH
SUSTAINABLE FOREST-BASED
ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT
(NELFED)

The research project has a two-pronged approach. On the one hand, it focuses on the increased production, consumption, management, value-addition, and marketing of NTFPs as a development strategy to improve the livelihoods and quality of life of forest-dependent adivasis. On the other hand, it aims at the revival, restoration, and enhancement of local biodiversity and forest ecosystem from the point of view of the sustainability of tribal life and natural resources.
